



# Are women with a foreign background more likely to have an induced abortion as compared to non-immigrant women?

- A cross-sectional study in Stockholm, Sweden

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# What is known about sexual and reproductive health and women with a foreign background?

- Most research on maternal health, pregnancy outcomesless on family planning and abortion\*
- Immigrant women
  - seek induced abortion to a higher extent than nonimmigrants\*\*
  - have less experiences of contraceptive use than nonimmigrants\*\*\*

### WHAT?

Among women seeking abortion care investigate if:


- women with foreign background are overrepresented
- socio-demographic- and reproductive factors differ between women with a foreign background and non-immigrant women

#### **DEFINITION:**

"Foreign background": foreign-born and 2<sup>nd</sup> generation immigrant (born in Sweden with both parents born abroad)


### HOW?

- Cross-sectional study, at eight abortion clinics,
   Stockholm County (repres. >90% of all abortions)
- Inclusion criteria
  - seeking abortion care and decided to induce
  - 18 yrs and above
- Questionnaire-based, face-to-face-interviews by midwives
- Interpreter used when needed



### - Over-represented?

### - AGE DISTRIBUTION

- All- in accordance with national statistics
- 2<sup>nd</sup> generation- younger
- Foreign-born- older

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



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#### CONCLUSION

- Cannot say if women with a foreign-background are overrepresented among women seeking abortion care
- We need to better understand the results related to 2<sup>nd</sup> generation immigrant women
- A need to focus contraceptive counselling to women with a foreign background
  - young 2<sup>nd</sup> generation immigrant women
  - foreign-born women post-partum
