At Boulder Abortion Clinic, our purpose is to provide the safest possible abortion care and termination of pregnancies for fetal anomalies or other medical indications. Women must be free to make their own choices about their lives, bodies, and family needs. We believe that women are entitled to the best medical care available regardless of their decision to carry the pregnancy to term or to have an abortion.
